

For each question, the beginning of the response is provided. There is ample space below for the illustration of the answer! As well, for the interrogative question sheets, the questions are related. This set-up provides the opportunity for a short conversation. Repetition of certain types of questions are, at times, included and many of the questions will help to review "the basics". In addition, there are 3 final tasks, and rubric evaluation tables.

The interrogative sheets contain a variety of themes, with each of the 5 questions beginning with the same interrogative. The month-titled question sheets each contain various interrogatives, and they have monthly-based themes. This unit is comprised of 2 sets of questionnaires. Incorporate them into your programs as you wish, but you may consider using questionnaire 1 for this school year, and questionnaire 2 for the following year.

*Each teacher will ultimately choose which activities he/she wishes to use; however, the following is a suggested model:*

1. At the start of the school year, photocopy a class set of "septiembre" sheets to be individually handed out. One period should be spent reviewing in detail each of the 5 questions. Encourage students to pencil in their own answers and give them time to illustrate their responses.

Although some questions may seem challenging at first, the following daily routine will allow for repetition and familiarity.

2. Next, the teacher may choose a different student each day to ask 5 questions to the class, selecting a different person to respond each time.

This same routine may continue for up to 1 month.

3. To provide further incentive, setting up a monthly or weekly draw for a prize adds excitement. Upon responding well to a question, students can receive a "billete"(provided in the package), write their name on it, and then place it in a decorated "¡ 5 Por Día" box. From this box, a winner may be chosen weekly or monthly. Stickers may also be given for a correct response.

The use of "¡ 5 Por Día" (*primary/junior edition*) in your classroom not only teaches students the essentials of questioning, but it also heightens their level of oral participation. Furthermore, "¡ 5 Por Día" question sheets provide the beginning of the response! This alleviates intimidation and provides a non-threatening and fun environment for speaking.
